Please consider this very carefully when you are thinking about taking your child out of school and remember that you will be fined if you take unauthorised leave!



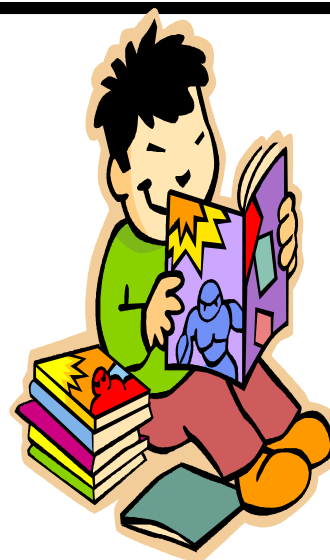
Parent Consultations
